






2. ABOUT THE CIVIC QUARTER

The Civic Quarter site sits to the south of Farnborough town centre and is currently home to the library, Rushmoor Borough Council offices, skate park, the now demolished Elles Hall, police station site, the soon to be demolished Farnborough Leisure Centre, as well as surface car parks and areas of open space.

The area is underused and has therefore been identified as a regeneration site of key importance. The site offers an opportunity to develop a new heart for the town centre, delivering homes to meet local housing requirements and providing an opportunity for intergenerational living. Regenerating the site will transform it into a vibrant space with new opportunities for town centre living, alongside ground floor spaces for bars, restaurants, shops, entertainment and community facilities including a new leisure centre.

We believe that the Civic Quarter provides a once in a generation opportunity to deliver a transformational project that stimulates the wider regeneration of the town centre as well as the local economy.

3. THE DRAFT MASTERPLAN

The regeneration of Farnborough Civic Quarter provides an opportunity to make positive impacts to the place and people of Farnborough, way beyond the Civic Quarter site boundary.



A number of principles that have been developed to guide the design of the scheme, these have been devised through a combination of consultation and site analysis. The principles focus on creating high quality, safe routes through areas of green and usable open space, culminating in a destination central park. These routes and spaces will be complemented by new retail and community uses to create a highly accessible and vibrant place to be.

4. A TOWN CENTRE FOR PEDESTRIANS & CYCLISTS

The current environment is dominated by highways, under-passes and under-used car parks that prioritise private car use over the safety and quality of pedestrian and cycle routes. The masterplan for the Civic Quarter starts with a simple ambition that will deliver transformational change: to remove the barriers of the existing road network and re-connect Farnborough town centre to its surroundings.

This development will allow pedestrians and cyclists to safely move around the Civic Quarter, helping to reconnect this part of the town and promote healthy, active and sustainable lifestyles.



5. A NEW LEISURE & CIVIC HUB FOR THE WHOLE COMMUNITY

An important objective for the regeneration of the Civic Quarter is to create a community heart. A new leisure centre, civic hub, and associated facilities will help form a busy and well-used year-round destination at the heart of the Civic Quarter.

The building fronts on to the central park to create a key connection between the ground floor cafe, the library and the adjacent adventure play area. The new leisure centre will provide modern sports and fitness facilities in a location that can benefit from the proximity to a new central park, bringing opportunities for outdoor activities and classes.

6. INNOVATIVE & SUSTAINABLE MOBILITY HUBS

Mobility hubs create space designed specifically to house public and shared transport options as well as some provision for private cars. This reduces the need for vehicles to move within and across the site, and allows public space to become car-free making it safer and easier for pedestrians and cyclists to move around. Two strategically-located mobility hubs will facilitate these sustainable forms of movement both into the Civic Quarter, and across Farnborough more widely, connecting the site with key locations across the town.

In addition to car parking, the mobility hub will also provide key facilities, including:

7. A VIBRANT PART OF THE TOWN CENTRE

The Civic Quarter masterplan celebrates Queensmead and transforms its southern end through new landmark buildings and retail units on the ground floors. The Civic Quarter brings a new hotel, a mix of new shops and community amenities that will complement the existing high street.

8. A PLACE TO CALL HOME

The masterplan focuses on creating town centre living, with easy access to local amenities, such as food, retail and an emphasis on a strong local community to create a successful new heart for Farnborough.

In order to achieve this, a variety of new apartment-style homes that meet the housing needs of people of different ages, and at different stages of their lives, are proposed. This would include homes for sale, homes for rent, and later living homes. Homes will be zero carbon ready and built to energy efficiency standards.


