
Landscape Strategy

Our nature-led vision for the masterplan, embracing and reflecting the surrounding landscape, started with the protection, conservation and enhancement of the River Wey.

- Protection of a continuous offset to the river, conserving existing habitats and retaining vegetation, respecting the neighbouring Nature Reserve.
- Inclusion of a broad green buffer to the river, integrating safe movement for wildlife and people and preserving the tranquillity found along the river edge.
- Design and inclusion of a broader framework of Green Infrastructure across the site, providing new green links to enhance and create habitats across the site and connect people and wildlife with the wider green infrastructure.



River Walk: Opportunity

Key principles:


- · Conserving the feel of the Riverside
- Incorporating the River into the proposal
- Increasing accessibility into, and along, the Riverside experience
- Providing new seating and riverside space from which to enjoy the environment
- Provide opportunity for people of all ages to enjoy nature and be active













Wey Walk: Community Focus

Key principles:

- Connecting public footpath and the primary school to the Wey Walk riverside via pedestrian and cycle routes
- Learning via play, information station and way finding
- Arrival, welcoming community space with gardens, orchards and open space
- Designated play space and informal play on the way
- · Integrated SUDS feature















Wey Water: Heritage Focus

Key principles:

- Active public realm themed by the water story and heritage of the Weyside Urban Village site
- Transitional journey from existing residential area to the new local centre and River Terrace area
- Formal water feature in the centre of a community gathering space to act as a focal point and identity marker
- Pocket park and 'play on the way' features provide doorstep green space

Green Space: Woodland / Nature Focus

Key principles:

- Connecting to, integrating with and enhancing existing Woodland and trees
- Providing a sense of urban forest garden through the development
- Woodland play and outdoor learning
- Ecology focused green buffer separating residential and employment uses
- Native woodland planting to reflect the wooded landscape character to the north
- Incorporation of SUDS and landscape mounding to create diverse habitats for local plants and wildlife
- Providing an appropriate gateway to the proposed SANG, located to the north of Weyside Urban village




